

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CREATION AND ISSUANCE OF  
A CLASS "C" LIQUOR LICENSE  
(TEMPORARY SPECIAL EVENT LIQUOR LICENSE)  
(Maywood Park District - 921 South 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue)  
(Food Festival – April 12, 2014)**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Maywood, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

**SECTION 1:** Pursuant to Chapter 117, Section 117.23(C) of the Maywood Village Code, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Maywood authorize the creation of a Class "C" Liquor License (Temporary License) in order to allow the Local Liquor Commissioner, in his discretion, to issue the Class "C" Liquor License to the Maywood Park District for purposes of permitting the Maywood Park District to conduct a special event on April 12, 2014 (or such other alternate day as determined by the Local Liquor Commissioner) within the Village of Maywood, Illinois at the 921 South 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue property. The Maywood Park District is the owner of the 921 South 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue property.

**SECTION 2:** The creation of the Class "C" Liquor License under Section 1 of this Ordinance is for the limited purpose of issuance to the Maywood Park District to conduct a special event as noted above, and, if the Class "C" Liquor License is issued by the Local Liquor Commissioner, the Maywood Park District is subject to compliance with the following conditions:

- A. The Class "C" Liquor License is only valid for April 12, 2014, or an alternate day in 2014 as approved by the Local Liquor Commissioner.
- B. In regard to the conduct of the special event on the 921 South 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue property, the Maywood Park District shall comply with the applicable provisions of Chapter 117 (Liquor) of the Maywood Village Code, including the Dram Shop Insurance requirement and BASSET Training for all servers of alcoholic beverages, as well as the other applicable provisions of State law and the Maywood Village Code, including but not limited to the Fire Prevention Code, the Plumbing Code, the Building Code, the

Property Maintenance Code, the Illinois Accessibility Code and the Zoning Code.

- C. All persons who sell or serve alcoholic liquor or handle alcoholic liquor on the licensed premises shall take and successfully complete a Beverage Alcohol Sellers and Servers Education and Training (BASSET) Program that has been certified by the State of Illinois. A copy of the BASSET course completion certificate(s) for each such person shall be made available at all times at the licensed premises for inspection by the Local Liquor Control Commissioner, or his or her designee.
- D. Service and consumption of alcoholic beverages at the Maywood Park District special event shall be inside the building located at the 921 South 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue property and shall be permitted only between the hours of 2:00 P.M. and 8:00 P.M. on the day of the special event. It shall be illegal to serve or consume alcoholic beverages on the 921 South 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue property in violation of the provisions set forth in this Ordinance.
- E. For purposes of complying with the "not more than 2 consecutive days" limitation of the Class "C" Special Events Liquor License regulations set forth at Section 117.23(C)(2) of the Maywood Village Code, the President and Board of Trustees find that: the duration of the special event will not exceed 24 hours.
- F. If a Class "C" Liquor License is issued to the Maywood Park District, the Class "C" Liquor License may be revoked immediately by the Local Liquor Control Commissioner in the event of a violation of the Maywood Liquor Code regulations or any of the provisions of this Ordinance by the Maywood Park District.
- G. The Village reserves the right to charge the Maywood Park District for special municipal services, such as police, fire and public works personnel and services that are necessary to protect the health, welfare and safety of the public and those individuals who attend the special event. By accepting the issuance of the Class "C" Liquor License, the Maywood Park District agrees to pay for such special municipal services provided by the Village, which are necessary to protect the health, welfare and safety of the public and those individuals who attend the special event. The charges for such special municipal services, if provided, will be based on the actual out-of-pocket costs incurred by the Village.

**SECTION 3:** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and approval as provided by law.
